Minutes:

The November minutes were approved by email.

Treasurer's Report:

The cash balance after current bills is \$93,090.19 and the fund balances are \$139,858.54. Total income for December was \$36,853.48, which was \$25,188.86 above planned giving. The total monthly income included a one-time designated gift of \$26,473.48 from Jim Anttonen, John Anttonen's brother, which was deposited into the Full Time Priest Fund. The net income for December was \$23,408.87, which was \$23,654.32 over budget. When adjusted for the one-time designated gift received during the month and the release of the reserve Landscaping to pay for the grotto pavers, the net loss for the month was -\$3,194.87.

Total year to date net income was \$226,530.60, which was \$74,540.60 over budget, primarily due to the one-time anonymous donation of \$42,000.00 plus the designated gift of \$26,654.32 from John Anttonen's brother, both of which were deposited into the Full Time Priest Fund. When adjusted for the release of the Landscaping reserve of \$4,636.72 plus the Full Time Priest Fund deposits of \$66,850.00, the net loss for the year was -\$9,350.70, driven by higher loan payments against principle totaling \$9,999.68 and additional investments in repairs and capital improvements. The current U.S. Bank loan balance is \$155,081.33. Mike Magette mentioned that he will look into moving some of our cash balances into a savings account with U.S. Bank to take advantage of higher interest rates.

Priest's Report:

Bishop Jos Tharakan toured the rectory building recently, and he thinks that it would make a good residence for a full-time priest with or without family. Using the rectory as a priest's residence would reduce the cost of calling a full-time priest by approximately 30%. Some renovation and repairs would be necessary, and the Diocese would help with procuring appliances for the kitchen. The church office will be moved to the current library space in the main church building, and the decorations for the parish hall will be moved to the Be Our Guest room where the caring closet was located.

Jennifer+ also distributed a New Priest Wage Determination estimate prepared by the Rev. Emily Van Hise, Canon to the Ordinary. The total for a single priest living in the rectory is \$69,728.28, and the total for a priest with family living in the rectory is \$92,816.00. The total for a single priest providing his/her own housing is \$87,251,88, and the total for a priest with family providing their own housing is \$110,339.88.

Finally, Jennifer+ reported that 12 people attended the first group Bible study meeting this past week.

Junior Warden Report:

Vance Wegner reported that work has begun on the necessary maintenance that must be completed to host the Diocesan convention this coming November, and he also reminded the vestry that three projects, namely the renovation of the grotto, the removal of three Norway pine trees, and the conversion of the parish hall light switches, have been carried forward into the new year. Finally, he mentioned that Phil Street, Clay Lisle, Becky Rowell, and Cindy Wolfenbarger have agreed to serve on the Buildings and Grounds Committee, and they will be meeting soon to review progress on reducing our carbon footprint.

ACTION ITEMS

Annual Meeting:

Both Jennifer Anttonen+ and Mary Buchanan will make a presentation on our conversations with the Diocese about what is required from us to call a full-time priest to serve at Holy Nativity. They will also challenge the congregation to move forward toward this goal sooner rather than later.

Proposed Budget for 2023:

Mike Magette reviewed with the vestry the proposed budget for 2023, which projects total income of \$172,675.00 and total expenses of \$158,191.00 for a net income of \$14,484.00. The overhead projector is no longer available, so the budget has been printed for hand-out at the annual meeting. Mike Magette will review the entire budget and ask for approval by the congregation at the annual meeting on Sunday, 1/29/23.

Irrigation District: The Meridian & Nampa Irrigation District has been charging the church approximately \$500.00 annually for water that we are not receiving. The church has a deep well for irrigation. Jon Anson has met with the Irrigation District and arranged for the church to pay a one time fee of approximately \$225.00 to \$250.00. A letter of agreement will be sent to the church by the Irrigation District to be signed and returned with a check. The church will no longer pay an annual fee for water that is not available to us for our use. By signing the agreement, we will not be permitted to submit an application to the Meridian & Nampa Irrigation District for irrigation water anytime in the future.

Office Copier: The new office copier will be set up by Fisher's Technology in the next three or four weeks.

Girl Scout Cookie Booth in the Parish Hall: Lilian Dwight has asked permission to set up a Girl Scout cookie booth in the parish hall during coffee hour. The vestry considered this to be a youth fundraiser activity, and permission was granted.

Canopy Roof Repair: There is a leak in the canopy over the walkway between the main church building and the parish hall. This leak just over the parish hall doors will be repaired by K D Roofing.

Striping of the Parking Lot: Vance Wegner suggested that the striping of the parking lot might be better done professionally, and he requested permission to gather three bids for consideration. He also asked to include with each bid the cost to fill the cracks with hot tar to extend the life of the parking lot.

New Treasurer and New Pledge Secretary: Donna Lofton, retiring Treasurer, and Darwin Buchanan, retiring Pledge Secretary, will be recognized and thanked for their years of service at the annual meeting this coming Sunday, and Mary Buchanan will introduce Sue Pahlas as our new Treasurer and Bob Burnz as our new Pledge Secretary.

The meeting ended at 9:15 p.m. with the recitation of the Lord's Prayer.
