Pastoral Care • Caring Connection Ministry


The Pastoral Care is starting a "Caring Connection Ministry".



FEBRUARY VESTRY MEETING

February 16, 2023 | 7pm | Library



Barbara Samparisi opened the meeting at 7:02 p.m. with the Prayer for Vestries.

Minutes:

The November minutes were approved by email.

Treasurer's Report:

The cash balance after current bills is \$89,948.92, and the fund balances are \$145,494.32. The Full Time Priest Fund balance is \$91,395.48, and the Building Fund balance is \$15,049.60. Total income for January was \$19,808.48, which was \$4,079.48 above planned giving, due to additional income and fewer expenses. The current U.S. Bank loan balance is \$155,230.57.

Priest's Report:

Jennifer Anttonen+ reported that there was a good response from the congregation to her posting of sign-up sheets on the bulletin board in the parish hall.

Looking into purchasing new robes for Acolytes and Lay Eucharistic Ministers. The cost of new robes is \$128.00 each for acolyte robes and \$170.00 each for adult Lay Eucharistic Ministers.

Jennifer+ also asked that the thermostat for the Meeting Room in the Rectory be programmed so that it is heated for Bible study on Friday mornings.

Jennifer+ and John Anttonen are the chaplains for retired priests in the Diocese of Idaho. They are planning for Holy Nativity to host a Celebration of Life service followed by a reception for Fr. Charlie Burger, who recently passed from this life to the life to come. Matt Wheeler is making sure that our organ is working for the Memorial service. A reception will follow. That service will be on March 2, at 11:00 a.m. Parishioners have been asked to help provide food.

Robin Horn is looking into Sunday School Vacation Bible School and Formation for children. There will be a Sunday School Teacher's Meeting on Sunday, 2/26/23 after the morning service.

Senior Warden's Report:

Mary Buchanan received a call from a men's AA group that would like to meet at Holy Nativity from noon until 1:00 p.m. every day Monday through Friday, and they are offering to pay

\$200.00 per month. The vestry approved their request, and Mary will follow up to formalize the arrangements.

Mary reported that Donna Lofton is still acting as treasurer, and she plans on beginning the training for Sue Pahlas later next month.

Mary also asked Vance Wegner to follow up with Phil Street and Clay Lisle about plans for the Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper.

Junior Warden's Report:

Vance Wegner reported that Idaho Interfaith Power & Light is planning an interfaith climate festival on Sunday afternoon, April 23rd, the day after Earth Day. This event will be hosted by Congregation Ahavath Beth Israel. The vestry was pleased to learn about this event, and Vance will provide details for a bulletin announcement.

Vance also reported that the roof over the walkway between the main church building and the parish hall has been repaired. K D Roofing will be returning to repair a leak in the rain gutter.

Finally, Vance reported that he has purchased a mini-vacuum to help clean up dead flies in throughout the nave, and he will follow up with DML Heating and Air Conditioning to determine how to prevent flies from gaining access to our worship space.

Fellowship Report:

Sandi Koerner reported that the coffee hour restart has been successful, and the Bingo Party went well with 50-60 people in attendance. She is considering a dessert social later this spring.

Outreach Report:

Barbara Samparisi recommended that the church buy an AED unit for emergency use if someone was having a heart attack on our property. The vestry liked the idea, and suggested that the narthex would be the best location for an installation. Sandi Koerner, who is a nurse, will gather some more details. Barbara also shared information with the vestry about local restaurants that make donations to churches when parishioners dine at their location. The vestry approved her suggestion and recommended that we schedule a night out quarterly for any parishioners who might enjoy such an occasion and use the

donations received from the restaurants toward the purchase of an AED. Barbara also recommended that the church's tax identification number be made available, and Mike Magette offered to make this information available to anyone making a purchase for the church.

ACTION ITEMS

Parking Lot Striping:

Vance Wegner presented three bids for repairing, sealing, and striping the parking lot and widening the wheelchair ramps. After discussing the condition of the parking lot, the vestry decided that repairing and sealing the parking lot in front of the rectory would be a good idea at a later date when we can better afford a major project. The main parking lot needs to be replaced, which could possibly be done in sections, also at a later date as part of a comprehensive plan.

Office Relocation and Copier Delivery:

Mary Buchanan learned from Matt Wheeler that the installation of an internet connection in the main church building would be a major undertaking. After discussion, the vestry decided to leave the office where it is currently located in the rectory building and to proceed with the delivery and installation of the new copier as soon as arrangements can be made with Fisher's Technology.

Rectory Upgrade:

Jennifer Anttonen+ presented a plan to upgrade the rectory building to render it usable as a possible residence for a full-time priest. Vance Wegner will be working with Mary Buchanan to oversee this project. A work day will be scheduled during March for cleaning and painting after some prep work has been completed. This upgrade should be completed this spring prior to the interviewing of possible candidates.

The meeting ended at 8:58 p.m. with the recitation of the Lord's Prayer.
