We have had a number of parishioners offer to help make the "house a home" by purchasing or giving additional needed items. We are confident that together, we can help this family to settle in as quickly as possible, feel the love from their new community, and know they've found a wonderful home at Holy Nativity.

CHRISTMAS FAMILY OUTREACH



This year, we sponsored two families from Meridian Elementary School (MES) for our Giving Tree Christmas Family Outreach. Tags representing the needs and wishes of our two families decorated our Giving Tree, set up in the Narthex by the First Sunday of Advent (Dec. 3rd). All gifts were collected by the 17th and delivered to MES on December 21st. We were met by the MES Counselor and some of the Administrative Staff, who were very appreciative to accept this outpouring of love for their families and so moved by the thoughtfulness and genuine concern we have for our neighbors. The MES staff coordinated with the two families to privately pick up their gifts later that day.

In addition to providing gifts of toys, books, games, art supplies, home goods, gift cards, shoes, and clothing, Holy Nativity parishioners contributed an additional \$1,100 to the Christmas Family fund this year! With these extra funds, we purchased gift cards from Zoo Boise so that each family can purchase a year's membership to attend the zoo whenever they'd like once they activate their memberships. This will provide these families with many special memory-making adventures in the coming year! We also purchased gift cards to: Chevron for fuel/automotive-only needs, IHOP, Lowe's, and Shoe Carnival.

From the 2 Cents a Meal fund, \$600 in family-friendly WinCo gift cards were purchased for each of the two families. (Just an FYI, these family-friendly WinCo gift cards prohibit the purchase of tobacco and alcohol products.) With so many generous donations to the 2 Cents a Meal fund in 2023, we were able to purchase an additional \$400 in smaller denomination WinCo family-friendly gift cards, which were given to the MES Counselor to share with other MES families in need of a little extra help putting food on the table. There



are also some "angels in disguise" in our parish who, for the fourth year, generously donated Walmart gift cards to be disbursed to other Meridian Elementary families. (In the past, the Counselor has shared with us that quite a few families rely on the school as a resource of financial help throughout the year, especially during the winter months. He typically receives numerous phone calls or emails the last few days before the Winter Break from parents/guardians panicking over how to feed their children during the school break, pay the rent/mortgage and utilities. These extra gift cards provide MES with the means to quickly remedy a stressful time, providing some extra food staples, baby supplies, or hygiene and cleaning supplies for a few more days.)

An extremely helpful community outreach program of their own accord, The Holy Nativity Be Our Guest team contributed two heaping bags of food and treats (weighing at least 50 lbs. each, if not more!) for the two families. Four additional bags of these goodies were also given to the Counselor to share with other MES families, as many of the items can be easily tucked in backpacks for those who participate in the Backpack

Program. We also took an opportunity to share details about the Be Our Guest Meals with the MES staff. I later sent an email to the Counselor, which he can forward to the MES staff or quickly pull up to share when speaking one-on-one with MES families.

I'd like to thank each person at Holy Nativity who contributed time, talent, and/or funds to this vital outreach program. These gifts all make a positive impact for the families and is just one way we become the hands and feet of Jesus in our community. Training by invitation or nomination (speak to your priest or deacon or call the Diocesan Office, Canon Emily or Deacon Tammy Jones) is offered once or twice yearly to lay people who seek to develop and hone their skills in interpretation of Scripture, approaches to homiletics and practice preaching within a group setting.

Lay preachers are licensed by the Diocese and preachers serve at the discretion of the priest/ deacon or senior warden in charge of the parish. Licenses are renewed through regular training, group work and feedback. Feel called? We might be ready to hear your voice!

Vestry Meeting Minutes

December 17th & 20th, 2023

Special Vestry Meeting

December 17, 2023 • 3PM

Present: Bishop Jos Tharakan, Barbara Samperisi, Mary Buchanan, Sandra Koerner, Jon Anson, Richard Jones, Vance Wegner, Cindy Wolfenbarger and Karen Ryker. Absent: Mike Magette

The Vestry meeting continued at 4:42 pm after the departure of Bishop Jos.

The first order of business was the need to remove the wooden shed in the Rectory back yard and replace it with a more substantial metal building which can be used to hold yard tools, etc. Vance has gotten a bid from Spartan Home Industries for dismantling in the amount of \$1400.00. This includes haul-off of materials and recycling of metal roof. Jon offered to use his equipment to demolish the shed and haul off debris. This would save us money but unfortunately, he is not able to do it until spring. Time is of the essence as we need to clean up that area before a new priest arrives. Vestry voted to accept the bid from Spartan Home Inc. and will ask them to begin immediately.

New Shed: Vance spoke with 3 local shed companies and received bids. Vance feels that the bid from Stor-Mor Sheds is the best for our needs. The vestry voted unanimously to accept the bid from Stor-Mor Sheds.

Bathroom floor cleaning: Our cleaning service gave us a very reasonable bid to clean/refurbish the tiles/grout on the bathroom floors. They were unaware that the tiles had been sealed with an acrylic product. Getting it off has taken many hours and the trying of different solvents. The hours spent have gone way over the estimate. The Vestry agreed to cover the cost of additional labor.

New Church Office: The church office needs to be moved from the Rectory to the Library room. This entails getting phone/wi-fi service installed. Mary has contacted Sparklight but does not know the cost yet. A desk for the priest will need to be purchased.



The Vestry reviewed the potential cost of having a Priest-In-Charge outline. The total annual cost for priest with family, living in the Rectory is \$92,816. This includes salary, health and dental insurance, Self-employment tax reimbursement and continuing education. The Vestry felt that it was appropriate.

A unanimous vote was taken to call Fr. Shibu to be our next Priest-In-Charge.

Next meeting will be held on December 20, 2023, at Jennifer Anttonen's home at 7:00pm.

The incoming priest has NO furniture so we will have to begin furnishing the Rectory. Several ways were discussed and about how to obtain furniture and other household items.

Minutes of November meeting were approved by e-mail. The meeting was held at the Anttonen residence and called to order at 7:19pm with Cindy reading the Prayer for Vestries.

The main purpose of this meeting is to approve the budget for the coming year. As Mike, our Finance Chair, is ill and cannot attend, Mary presented the 2024 budget

that Mike prepared. A few items were discussed:

- 1. Slavic Church rent has been raised to \$350 from \$300.
- 2. The monthly budget for Be Our Guest has been raised to \$500.
- 3. The salary package for our new Priest-In-Charge.
- 4. Continuing financial assistance for EFM participants.

This budget shows a deficit of \$60,911. Mary has spoken to Bishop Jos about the possibility of getting financial help from the Diocese. Bishop said he would get with Barbara Rudin to see what can be done. Jon mentioned at the October meeting that there were discretionary funds available through the Diocese for capital improvements. Jon and Mary applied, and we received a \$10,000 grant which will help pay for the HVAC replacement.

Cindy asked if the church would continue to reimburse EFM participants for their fees. We did that this year when a group began meeting in the Parish Hall. The Vestry did not approve an ongoing reimbursement, just a one-time payment. We decided that we would reimburse First-time participants from now on.

The Priests salary was reviewed. The Priest and his family will live in the Rectory. This led to discussions on how best to furnish their home as they have very few possessions. Mary asked Mike if it would be appropriate to use some of the funds that we would have to spend on moving costs. Mike agreed at this point to set aside \$2000 for furniture, etc. The Diocese agreed early on to purchase a stove, refrigerator, and dishwasher. Jon graciously agreed to donate a television. Mary will contact the family to ascertain what they need, color preferences. The congregation will be afforded the opportunity to donate or purchase items once we know particulars. Sandra's quilting group expressed an interest in making quilts for the children's beds.

The Vestry unanimously voted to approve the budget for 2024, having faith that all will be well.

Two Vesty positions need to be filled at the Annual Meeting on January 28, 2024. Mary spoke to Jarrod Horn and Phil Street, and they agreed to be Vestry candidates.

Bishop Jos is planning a Paradise Point Dinner to be held in the Parish Hall on the 10th of February.

Our next Vestry meeting will be January 24, 2024, before the annual meeting.
