

Investing For \$9,876 Growth []]

Making GREAT progress towards our goal!!!

After announcing the need to replace our HVAC System, the total expense of this replacement, and how we planned to begin a Capital Campaign to bring in the funds to cover the cost, the congregation of Holy Nativity collectively came together to make some impressive headway with this effort.

To date, we have raised \$9,876 and we couldn't be more pleased. We're very close to achieving our goal.

UPDATE: We do need to inform you that in our last newsletter, we explained that we needed to consider an upgrade to our sound system. So we contacted Valiant, a local Audio Visual System company, asking to have their technician give us an idea of cost. After looking over our system, he determined that although it certainly isn't the newest system out there, it works and really only needed a few adjustments. The young man (Jacob) did not charge Holy Nativity for his consultation and simply said he was happy to help us out - what a blessing!! So with that, we have reduced our Capital Campaign amount down to \$15,000 to cover just the cost of the HVAC replacement.

Holy Nativity must do what is necessary to maintain our church buildings and thus invest in our continued church growth.

Episcopal Church of the Holy Nativity MARCH VESTRY MEETING

March 20, 2024 | 7pm | St. Francis Room



MINUTES:

The minutes of the February meeting were approved by e-mail.

Meeting called to order at 7:00 with Sandy Koerner reading the Prayer for Vestries.

CHRISTIAN HUNGATE:

Rev. Alice Farquhar-Mayes presented a wonderfully written report from the Discernment Committee concerning Christian Hungate and his desire to become ordained. Christian is a very impressive and intelligent young man with a deep desire to be ordained. After discussion, all were in favor of signing the form giving the Vestry's approval of Christian Hungate being considered for Postulancy.

FINANCE:

- **Budget Adjustment**: Jerrod Horn explained that we had budgeted more than was required for Fr. Shibu's Pension Plan. After adjusting the budget for the correct amount, it will save us approximately \$2000 per month. This revision cuts our annual deficit in half. Jerrod will re-allocate the money and put it in an account for other expenses.
- **February monthly income** was a little light, but this is typical for this time of the year.
- Copier Contract issue has hopefully been solved. The new contract will start in April. This should help to alleviate overages and make it easier to check it each month.
- HVAC Capital Campaign: We received \$4,210 more for the HVAC Capital Campaign so we have almost \$10,000 which is 2/3 of the way toward our goal!
- Water Damage: Our Insurance Company has offered to pay us \$4,715 towards repairing the water damage caused to the walls in the educational wing. Phil Street will obtain bids from 3 contractors to repair the damage.

PRIEST'S REPORT:

- Youth Group: Fr. Shibu stated that he is in the process of forming a youth group for Holy Nativity. He is in communication with some other Youth leaders and making plans. Once a plan is in place, he will be contacting parishioners who have youth.
- Hospitalizations or Illnesses: Fr. Shibu asked that we please be sure to notify him if there are hospitalizations or illnesses within our parish so he can call on those individuals.

JUNIOR WARDEN:

- Tree Removal: Phil told us the trees at the west end of the educational wing will be removed on Mar. 27th. A week later the gutters will be cleaned out.
- **Plumber**: A plumber will be coming on Friday, Mar. 22 to check the water heater in the Rectory.
- Cleaning Company: We have negotiated a new contract with ResCom to do the cleaning of the church buildings. The plan is to have them come in on Saturdays. They have been provided a listing of tasks that are expected.

SENIOR WARDEN:

- Audio System: Mary reported that she and Fr. Shibu met with Jacob from Valiant Integrations to discuss our audio system. Although our system is outdated, it works, but just needed some adjustments. This was done and the sound was much better last Sunday. This being the case, we have adjusted the Capital Campaign down to \$15,000 to only cover the HVAC replacement costs.
- Cinco de Mayo: It was suggested that we have a Cinco De Mayo celebration on Sunday, May 5th. There will be sign-up sheets for Mexican potluck dishes. We discussed the idea of a piñata for the youth. There will

also be a silent auction. Funds raised will go towards the HVAC system.

Appreciation: Mary also expressed her deep gratitude for all the work Jerrod has been doing for the vestry, especially with the copier issue.

FELLOWSHIP:

Coffee Hour Coverage: Sandy will be out of town until May 2nd. Barbara Samperisi and Darwin Buchanan will help out with Coffee Hour while she is gone.

BE OUR GUEST MEALS:

Be Our Guest: Barbara said that for some reason, the numbers of guests has been low at the meals. Michelle M. is gone for a few weeks so the volunteers are doing their best until she gets back.

ADJOURNMENT

Meeting adjourned at 8:30 with the recitation of the Lord's Prayer.
