

Financial aid is available for any camper who needs assistance covering **Tier I registration** costs. The Episcopal Church of the Holy Nativity will support up to one-half of the camp registration fee for one youth or teen camp *(not to include transportation, store money or additional purchases)*. It is the responsibility of the camper's family to provide the \$50 non-refundable deposit for each registered camp and any camp fees not covered by the scholarship.

Holy Nativity is pleased to be able to assist our campers with Paradise Point Camp Scholarship funding. Applicants will be reviewed and considered for approval on a first-come, first-served basis. The Episcopal Diocese of Idaho also offers scholarship funds (see below).

Upon review, applicants will be notified by e-mail of camp scholarship approval.

Episcopal Church of the Holy Nativity JUNE VESTRY MEETING May 22, 2024 | 7pm | St. Francis Room



April Minutes: Minutes were approved by e-mail.

Call to Order: Meeting called to order at 7:00pm with Sandra reading the Prayer for Vestries.

Internet Update: The office has been using a "Hot Spot" for internet service, which includes telephone service. This has been more than adequate for office use. Mary and Sandra had been away and had watched Sunday Services on Zoom. Both reported that the reception was 100% better than previous times. The "hot Spot" works well in the office and the Parish Hall for those times that we need internet connection. The new system that Matt has researched is \$300.00 a month. We are now paying \$130.00 a month. It was decided that it is not necessary to make a change right now as everything is working for us. Vestry realizes that this is a short-term solution and will see what the future holds for this technology.

Finance Chair • Jerrod Horn

Office Copier Expense: Jerrod reported that we received a bill for \$600.00 from the copier company for overages. Jerrod contacted our service representative for an explanation. He has not received documentation to support this charge and will continue to pursue this matter. We could have problems with the internal copier count, which is relayed to Canon and then billed through Fishers, the leasing company. We may have to once again keep a log of copies made.

Financial Report: Jerrod presented the financial statement to the Vestry. Income has been strong, over budget, but will traditionally drop off in the summer. We are in good shape, financially.

Quickbooks Conversion: The new Quickbooks will be installed, with 5 user access. This is program is less

expensive for the first year and then about the same price as the program we are currently using.

Priest's Report • Fr. Shibu Pananchikkal

Youth Group: The Youth Group has been given the name W.I.N.G.S. (Worship, Integrity, Nurture, God, Service). The initial gathering will be on June 1 with bowling and a meal.

Kenya Mission Project: Ellen Blackman, Dean at St. Michael's is involved with the Kenya Mission Project. Each Anglican priest is paid with one cow. Each cow is priced at \$600. The Diocese is asking for each parish to purchase a cow. The vestry thought that this might be a great opportunity for the Youth Group to hold a fundraiser. Jerrod suggested that we match the funds raised to show solidarity.

Parking On Church Property: Fr. Shibu reported that many vehicles were in the parking lot last Wednesday. This may have been overflow from the library...we're not sure.

Fellowship Dinners: Fr. Shibu and his family attended the Fellowship Dinner at Jerrod and home. He encouraged us to continue this mission as he feels it is so beneficial to get to know other parishioners.

Senior Warden's Report • Mary Buchanan

Paradise Point Application: Mary passed out the Paradise Point scholarship application for review. We will give up to 50% of the fee as a scholarship. The Diocese also has funds available for scholarships. The non-refundable deposit of \$50.00 is the responsibility of the family.

Sound Equipment: The sound equipment currently stored in the Blue Room can be given to the Youth Group to sell for funds for their use.

New Commercial Dishwasher: The commercial dishwasher has been ordered and will be delivered between May 30th and June 7th. Phil will contact the plumber we use and let him know the dishwasher is on the way.

Boise Rescue Mission: The Boise Rescue Mission is asking for donations of female personal care products. They currently serve 120+ women every evening at their shelter and desperately need hygiene supplies. They will provide a barrel to hold donations and will pick it up at the end of the campaign. The vestry agreed to be involved in this mission.

Blood Drive: A parishioner asked about the church cohosting a Blood Drive. After reviewing all that would be involved it was decided not to pursue this project.

VOD Duties: Mary went over the duties of the Vestry On Duty each Sunday. It is important to make sure the church is locked, and lights turned off.

Junior Warden's Report • Phil Street

HVAC System: Phil reported that the new HVAC equipment is installed and working. While the company was here, Phil had them program all the thermostats.

Water Damage Repairs: The water damage repairs have been completed and paint in all Educational wing rooms has been touched up. Everyone agrees they did a great job.

Ground Clean-up: Clean-up day was successful even though only one Girl Scout and one Boy Scout came to help. Nonetheless, a lot was accomplished.

Cinco de Mayo: Sandy reported that the Cinco de Mayo potluck was a big success and the silent auction brought in about \$400.00.

Stained glass windows: Richard Jones was approached by a parishioner asking why we did not have stained glass windows. They were removed when the Catholic Diocese sold the property us. We would all love to have stained glass, but recognize this could be a fairly large expense as we have 13 windows in the Sanctuary. Richard volunteered to do some research and speak to local stained glass artists.

Children's Sunday: June 30th will be "Children's Sunday". Jerrod has 4 interesting games for the children during coffee hour. He asked that he be allowed to spend up to \$75.00. Vestry approved this expense.

Basketball Hoop replacement: When the old shed was cleaned out in preparation for the new one, the basketball hoop was discarded. Richard has kindly offered to replace it.

Adjourned: 8:16pm with the vestry reciting the Lord's Prayer.
