


We will be having a meeting during coffee hour on Sunday, November 10th

Thanksgiving Food Box Program • 2024



The Thanksgiving Food Box program is a family-to-family act of charity. By making a contribution, we share the tradition of Thanksgiving with families in need.

Last fall, the St. Vincent de Paul society distributed enough turkeys with all the trimmings to provide complete Thanksgiving dinners for about **13,300** people. The society works with Boise and West Ada School District counselors to provide Thanksgiving dinners to over 450 of the districts' poorest families. This year, as the country sees rising costs of living, **the need continues to be great**.

Every autumn, Holy Nativity has joined efforts with St. Vincent de Paul and other area churches in the Thanksgiving Food Box Program. The cost to fill a single Thanksgiving food box that feeds a family of 4-6 is \$80.

If you would like to help in this effort, please make a contribution by Sunday, November 17th noting "Thanksgiving Food Box" on the memo line of your check or if donating cash, indicate this on the outside of an envelope. Our donations will be collected and donated in time to help families in need.

WHAT IS THE VESTRY?

The Vestry is the lay governing body of Holy Nativity. It helps define the mission of the congregation, selects the rector of the Church, ensures effective organization, and manages the Church's resources and finances.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF A VESTRY MEMBER

A Vestry member serves a three-year term, serves as a liaison to at least one other Church committee or ministry group, attends Church and Church events on a regular basis, and supports the annual stewardship campaign through pledging and raising funds. Candidates must be able to fulfill all of the requirements of the office.

A Diocesan Convention Delegate attends church regularly, supports the annual stewardship campaign and supports the ministries of Holy Nativity.

VESTRY MEETING MINUTES Thursday, October 16, 2024 All Saints Room | 7PM



Minutes: Minutes of September meeting were approved by e-mail.

Call to Order: Meeting called to order a 7:00pm with Mary Buchanan reading the Prayer for Vestries.

Financial • Jerrod Horn:

- 2025 Budget: Jerrod presented a preliminary budget for 2025. There will be some slight increases for Coffee Hour, utilities, property insurance and other incidentals.
- The Stewardship Committee has set a goal of \$220,000.00. We are trending to be over-budget for income this year, so this figure is very attainable. We need to refinance the loan for our mortgage in 2025. Jerrod will begin the process after the first of the year. The Vestry will be given up-to-date financials later. They are not available at the time of this meeting.

Priest Report • Fr. Shibu:

- Facebook / Instagram: Fr. Shibu expressed a concern about continuing with our present Facebook account. He would like to see a new account made as well as making an Instagram account for the church and youth group. A new Facebook account would be able to track the demographics of the people viewing the site. Instagram is used more universally and Fr. Shibu said that he can set that up. Fr. Shibu has asked that he be provided with the names of those parishioners watching services on Zoom.
- Wegner's Generosity: Vance and Marsha Wegner have delivered a trailer load of firewood to the Rectory, their gift to Fr. Shibu and family. Many thanks to the Wegners.
- Thanksgiving Vacation: Fr. Shibu will be taking a Thanksgiving vacation on November 24th thru the 29th.
 Fr. Laddie will to cover during this time.

Outreach Effort for Richard Norris: The church was contacted by Richard Nourse, an elderly man living close to us. He has an extensive collection (over 3000) of Nativity Scenes that he wanted to donate to us. Fr. Shibu, Amritha and Linda Czarkowski visited Richard and found him living in difficult circumstances. Most of the home is full of Nativity scenes. We will take a good share of the Nativity scenes. We do have some already and they are stored in the benches in the Parish Hall. We need to decide where we can store this gift and how to use them. The Vestry would like to organize a work party to clean and organize his home. We need to contact the family who lives in Utah to get permission. It would be good to honor Richard at a church service.

Sr. Warden • Mary Buchanan:

- Altar Backdrop Construction: The Altar backdrop is nearly complete. Several generous donations have been made, leaving at this time \$1930 left to cover the cost. Richard moved; Cindy seconded, that we use funds from the building fund to cover the balance due. Carried unanimously.
- Vestry Positions: There will be two vestry positions to be filled at the Annual meeting. Those interested in a Vestry position need to submit a Bio to the Vestry. These applicants need to have been members for at least one year. It was decided to have the Annual Meeting on January 12th. This will be announced in the Newsletter.
- Vehicles Parked for Hours: We have had vehicles using our parking lot during the week, just parking or loitering. This is concerning with Anvid and Athmika coming and going from the Rectory. The police have been called once, but vehicle was gone. The license number was given to the police. Putting up Security

cameras was discussed. Jerrod will investigate some systems that may work for us. Jon said he was working on signage warning of the penalty for illegal parking. The City of Meridian has guidelines.

- IEF Foundation Representative Visit: Janet Hasson from Idaho Episcopal Foundation, (IEF) has let Mary know that some churches are incorporating IEF presentations during their Lenten Luncheons. Various topics could be advice on wills, trusts, etc. Janet will be here on December 8th to present materials to those interested.
- Shirts for Holy Nativity: Linda Burnz has asked about ordering tee shirts and sweat shirts for parishioners. Jerrod brought up that St. Stephens has done this for their church family online. Mary will investigate this and report back. This brought up the subject of changing our Logo from what we are using now to one that reflects Holy Nativity. Mary had designed one years ago but did not use it. Mary shared a picture of this logo and the Vestry thought it was one that we should use.

Jr. Warden • Phil Street:

- Fall Clean-up: Phil Street. It is time to schedule a Fall Clean-Up. In the last two years the Girl Scouts have not shown up like they used to. They have use of the building free of charge with the understanding that they help with Clean-Up days. Mary will reach out to the Scout leaders to remind them of this agreement. Fall Clean-up Day is scheduled for November 16th from 10:00am to noon.
- Irrigation Pump Repair: The irrigation pump needed to be repaired at the cost of \$2,000. A replacement pump could cost \$5,000 to \$6,000.
- Fire Inspection: We are due for our annual Fire Inspection. This will be done in November. Fire Extinguishers are already checked and certified.
- Janitorial Service: Cleaners are doing better. All work paid for has been completed. Cindy brought up a couple of concerns and Phil will check into it. The women's restroom has a bad odor, and the floor is not clean looking.

Quickbooks Software Update: Jerrod and Sue will be in the office next Wednesday to upgrade the church computer to the new Quikbooks program. We will have 4 licenses.

Communion Protocol: It was noted that typically, the congregation stands until they go up for communion and then return to their pew at which time they may be seated. It was decided that Vestry would remain standing and perhaps that will encourage more to remain standing. We realize that several people are not able to stand for any length of time. "Stand as you are able" has always been understood.

Meeting adjourned at 8:38pm with the Vestry reciting the Lord's Prayer.
