Monthly Message from Father Shibu, Priest-in-Charge

Calling All Bakers!






Wahooz Miniature GULF

VESTRY MEETING MINUTES

Thursday, October 19, 2024 All Saints Room | 7PM



Minutes: Minutes of the August meeting were approved by e-mail.

Priest's Report • Fr. Shibu:

- Family Home Visits: Fr. Shibu shared that he made 4 home visits in September. He was pleased with the visits as well as the families visited.
- Rev. Jennifer Departure: Fr. Shibu and Mary have been informed by Bishop Jos that he has requested Rev. Jennifer and John begin attending services at the Cathedral. This is standard practice when a new priest is hired. Rev. Jennifer was given an exception early on as she was charged with mentoring Fr. Shibu. The mentoring period ended just before Rev. Jennifer and John left for Canada. The Vestry on Duty will announce that Sunday the 22nd is their last Sunday with us.

Senior Warden's Report · Mary Buchanan:

- Piano & Organ: Mary reported that the piano currently on the altar will be removed on the 23rd of September. The organ will be serviced on the 25th. Michelle Sutherland, a member of the parish, knows how to play the organ as well as the piano.
- Altar Backdrop for Cross: Plans have been drawn up by a contractor who will construct the arch backdrop. Construction will begin on September 26th. A new cross is also being built by a friend of Sandi Koerner who is a skilled woodworker. He has volunteered to make the new cross to mount inside the arched backdrop at no cost to us. A few people have expressed a willingness to donate to this project so the bulk of the total cost should be taken care of without dipping into current funds.
 - Richard moved that we proceed with the backdrop, Jon seconded. Passed by unanimous vote.
- Muffin Thief: Twice someone entered the Parish Hall during service time and removed several of

the coffee hour items. On the third Sunday, Mary and Orve Hendrix stationed themselves in the Parish Hall. They did catch the person in the act and confronted her. Mary made it very clear that she was not to do that again. One solution is to lock the Parish Hall during the worship service.

- Walking Group: An interest has been expressed in resurrecting the Friday Walking Group. This could take place right after Friday Bible Study. Donna Lofton will be contacted to see if she has an interest in hosting this.
- Altar Flowers: In order to avoid any confusion about the flowers purchased for the altar on Sunday the Vestry on Duty will make an announcement naming the person/family who donated the flowers. The person will tell Darlene Stattner if they would like to have one of the bouquets taken to someone who is ill, etc. Plastic vases will be purchased for this purpose so we will not have a concern about the glass vase returned.

Fellowship · Sandy Koerner:

Sandi reminded us that the Harvest Festival is on October 11th at 6:00pm. There will be a Chili Cookoff with cornbread. Mary has obtained a pinata, Sandy will get pumpkins for the children to decorate. Bingo will be played, cards purchased as a Backdrop fundraiser. Prizes will be cakes, pies, or cupcakes, donated by parishioners.

Financial · Jerrod Horn:

Jerrod sent out a preliminary 2025 budget to the Vestry. He was absent so we did not discuss it.

Stewardship · Richard Jones:

Richard indicated that his committee has set a goal of \$220,000.

Angelo Samparisi has prepared two skits for us, at the beginning of the Stewardship campaign and at the end.

Parking Lot Issues • Fr. Shibu:

In the recent past Fr. Shibu has had to confront people, not parishioners, parking for long periods of time in front of the Rectory and behind the Parish Hall. The Vestry agreed that the police be called to handle this problem.

Diocesan Finance Committee • Jon Anson:

Jon is a member of the Diocesan Financial Commitee. He informed the Vestry that there has been an increase in attendance diocese wide, not only at Holy Nativity. A new director has been hired for Paradise Point.

Adjourned: Meeting adjourned at 8:07 p.m. with the Vestry reciting the Lord's Prayer.
